He has a girlfriend named Fatima (Charmaine Hess) and a mistress (he calls her his spare wheel), named Rosie. What can I say, Gatiepie likes his bread buttered on both sides," laughs Kevin.

Kevin's drama company, K.A.T.

(Kopdoekie-Afrikaans & Teater) was born in 1994. "With the new South Africa on the horizon, I started writing, because then I could write exactly what I felt," says Kevin. He became involved with various projects. Two of his memorable projects seen on kykNET included a 13-episode documentary Agter die Mynhoop and a one hour Christmas programme, Krismis in Reiger Park, of which he was writer, producer and presenter.
